An American Grace: A Prayer by Rod Murphy

Hebrew 4:16 – Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

Dear Heavenly Father,

Some think we call you Father out of some misplaced sense of patriarchal preference or gender superiority.

We call you Father because You are the Father of a Savior. For the world needs saving.

Has there ever been a time when no one called out Your name in the face of trouble or strife?

A character that is the summation of the qualities of the great cultures and nations that make our country. A character that can only be refined by numerous God-given trials and tribulations, wars and depressions and challenges, justified by our triumphs and repudiated by our failures.

From this character, can only arise a leadership. A special leadership. An American leadership.

A leadership that recognizes the importance of setting an example not only to one's country, but to an observing world and a watchful God.
